### NEW NEWSLETTER ITEMS

There was no Achievement Assembly today as the Year 6 children who wanted to be considered for the post of Year 6 School Councillor presented to the children in Years 2 to 6 in assembly of why they should be chosen. The children then voted for whom they thought would do the role well and represent Milton St John's during meetings with partnership schools throughout the year.

### **Shine Week**

The children had a fantastic time during our first SHINE week.

The week was split up as follows:

Monday was 'Show respect' day. Parent visitors came in and discussed their achievements with the children who enjoyed asking questions. We would like to thank Stacey Maurice, Rebecca Hatton, Sarah Coy and Melissa Baker who came and spoke with the children.



Tuesday was 'Honest' day where each class took part in an 'Honest Workshop'. The children discussed different moral dilemmas in small groups.

Wednesday was 'Include others' Day. Classes from Nursery - Year 6 paired up with another class and shared healthy snacks. It was really good to see the older children encouraging the younger children to try the snacks.

Thursday was 'Never give up' Day where Key Stage 2 children completed a Forest School Challenge, Key Stage 1 completed a team building challenge

and the Foundation Stage completed a den building challenge.

Friday was 'Excellence in all we do' where each class reflected on how we can 'let our light shine' and all the children made their own SHINE tealights to take home.

During the week all classes produced artwork for a SHINE display and the children in each class were given 3D letters spelling out 'SHINE', which they had to decorate and display in their classroom for the remainder of the year.

We would like to say a special thank you to Father David and Mrs Phillips for their inspiring assemblies on the theme of 'Never Give Up'.

As part of the SHINE week activities each class were awarded £75 from the PTA. The children had to think of ideas for how the money could be spent before presenting their ideas to Ms Tootill and Mrs Galbraith from the School Office who helped the children choose which ideas were the most beneficial to the whole class. The children then had the final vote as to how to spend their class budget.

This is how they voted :

<b>EYFS</b>	Playground equipment to improve outdoor learning e.g. scooters.
<b>Year 1</b>	Toy cars and felt tip/gel pens.
<b>Year 2a</b>	Train track, cars, fairies and animal figures to be used during wet play.
<b>Year 2b</b>	Lego and board games to be used during wet play.
<b>Year 3</b>	Lego, gel pens and games to be used during wet play.
<b>Year 4</b>	Cushions and rug for their reading area.
<b>Year 5</b>	A visitor linked to their curriculum theme.
<b>Year 6</b>	Games and construction toys to be used during wet play.
