Football at Milton St John's

It has been brought to our attention that some Parents think that Football is banned. There is no ban on football at Milton St John's Primary School. However, because we have 257 children and only a small, sloping playground, there are specific areas designated for football; this is timetabled so all children are given the opportunity to play. In a morning and after school we ask that the children do not play ball games whilst Parents bring or pick up their children due to the lack of space.

Planning Application

We would just like to bring to your attention that a planning application has been made to Tameside MBC for the land to the rear of 31 to 39 Carrhill Road. This is the land that used to be allotments behind the school (near the kitchen). If you require further information please see (web link). For your information, this application is in effect a renewal application for the development that was allowed on appeal.

We have contacted the Tameside Planning Department as the school had not received an official letter about this application and they have confirmed that as long as the Council receive responses before a decision is made, which is on or around 2.1.17, they can consider them, but Tameside MBC strongly suggest that if anyone has any comments they need to arrive in the next 2 weeks.

Snow Closure

We will always try and keep the school open! However under certain circumstances and for various reasons this is not always the case.

- 1. We do check with local weather stations and liaise with the Local Authority to try and gauge whether there is a likelihood of heavy snowfall. Unfortunately the forecasts are not always accurate and there is heavier snowfall than predicted.
- 2. The school has a number of staff who live outside the Mossley area. If there are not enough qualified staff available to come into school to open up and manage it safely then it cannot open due to Health & Safety reasons.
- 3. If the roads are dangerous then the school may not receive food deliveries and may be unable to provide a hot meal or food for the children at lunch time.
- 4. If the school boilers fail to operate we would need to call out an engineer to repair the fault. The School would have to close if we are not able to heat the school. If the heating fails during the day we would make a decision about school closure and contacting parents.

If there is heavy snowfall and also taking into account the above points, this is what will happen.

- 1. If necessary a decision to close will be made by 8.15am (or earlier if possible). However if the weather deteriorates throughout the day, we may also need to close school. A text will be sent to all Parents advising them that school is closed or closing.
- 2. The website will be updated throughout the day, providing that it can be accessed.
- 3. We will pass school closure information to TMBC and they will update their website.
- 4. If school remains open, Classes may need to be split and shared amongst others if we do not have enough members of staff to cover all classes.
- 5. If snow is set to continue over a number of days and we are aware of disruption to traffic, we may look at opening at 10am so that school can remain open.

Sending text messages is the most effective way that we can communicate with our parents.

Could you please ensure that the school has an up-to-date contact number, if you have recently renewed your mobile phone this is particularly important!
