#### Parent's Evening

Parent's Evening will be held on Tuesday 20 March and Wednesday 21 March, letters will be sent out this week to allow you to book the most convenient slot. We had a number of complaints from parents at the last parents evening that they couldn't hear teachers in the hall due to the noise children were making near the book fair.

### Class 5 - Heritage Trail Project

Some of you may have already heard that the Mossley Civic Society announced that they were awarded a confirmed grant of £35,900 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for the Routes to Roots project. Thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, the project aims to greatly raise the profile of Mossley Industrial Heritage Centre by increasing visitor numbers and encouraging children and adults to explore the heritage of Mossley in an engaging and fun way.

Working with Green Monster Arts, a local specialist educational arts provider, the Society will be working with class 5 to explore the heritage of Mossley and design an interactive walking trail from Milton St John's to the Industrial Heritage Centre. To start the project the children will be visiting the Heritage Centre on the morning of 8 March. Please could parents ensure the children have suitable footwear for the trip and are suitably clothed for the unpredictable weather.

### **Nursery Applications September 2018**

Please be advised that the deadline for all Nursery applications for September 2018 has now gone. Applications received going forward will go on a waiting list and be looked at should any spaces not be accepted (this will be following the Easter break). Acceptance of a Nursery place must be received by Tuesday 27 March, after this date we will assume that it is no longer required.

#### **Dangerous Parking**

Please could we ask Parents/Carers to be mindful of where you are parking in the bad weather, we had complaints from residents on Three Counties last week as one car in particular had been left on the bend where you exit the estate, almost in the middle of the road, making it dangerous and difficult for everybody else to manoeuvre around it. The same car had been left in the same place a few weeks ago when we had bad weather.

#### **Sports Relief 2018**

As part of Sports Relief, the Sports Council have decided that each class will take part in a fun run in the next few weeks during their PE lessons, to raise awareness about Sports Relief. #### **Text/Email Messaging Service Update**

As a school, it is very important that our parents/guardians are informed of updates and changes at school in addition to the personal updates you will receive about your child's progress and wellbeing.

From the week commencing Monday 5 March, the text messages you receive from school will appear differently on your phone.

Our service provider, Teachers2Parents, are excited to introduce an additional new security verification measure to allow parents/guardians to check that the messages you receive are from school.

Much like telephone banking, you will continue to receive messages from a secure number with the school message ID now in the body of the message, accompanied with a link at the beginning of the message to click through to a Teachers2Parents verification page; confirming that the sender of the message is genuine.


This added security measure is another step forward to help reassure parents/guardians of the safety and wellbeing of your child at school.



A typical message will look like this:

When you click to verify the message, you will be taken to the following screen:

The changes to the text messaging service will not affect use of the Teachers2Parents App, as this continues to offer built in user verification and end to end encryption of all



messages, plus you will still have secure access to term calendar and school noticeboard updates.

To take advantage of the Teachers2Parents app, please search and download 'Teachers2Parents' for **free** on iOS App store and Android smartphone devices.

We hope you agree, as we do, that this added security measure bolsters reassurance that any important communication about your child is safe and you can always be sure that it has been sent by our school.
