Some important information was given out to those that attended to help make things a bit easier should anyone want to respond/object to the development. This does need to be done as soon as possible and no later than Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September.

If you wish to this is how you can send your objections in a formal way to appropriate people at Tameside Planning and elected representatives of Mossley people. Being angry and upset and sounding off verbally and on FB and other social media is legitimate - but in itself does not achieve anything.

# TO BE HEARD YOU MUST RESPOND FORMALLY – EVERY LETTER AND EMAIL HAS TO BE LOGGED HERE IS THE KEY INFORMATION YOU MUST INCLUDE:

- 1. Your name and address
- 2. This reference is critical: 19/00489/FUL BROOKFIELDS MOSSLEY
- 3. State very clearly that you are opposed to the development and then list your objections if you need some help these are the key ones lots of people have articulated:
- Excessive overdevelopment in Mossley already
- Will involve impossible, forced and dangerous access due to the nature of the site
- Industrial traffic and congestion on an already hazardous, narrow and dangerous road
- Serious environmental risk and damage including flooding
- Long term increase of traffic on a very steep road with very restricted access both ends
- Direct risk of danger to local residents
- Direct risk of danger and accidents to children attending the school
- Damaging and destroying the heritage of the town
- Protected wildlife on the site
