Coronavirus Update

As parents will appreciate it is a difficult and unchartered time in the country with the threat of the Coronavirus. We, as a school, have to follow the advice of the Department for Education and Public Health England who are advised by the experts. We are managing risk and have to be careful about the potential unintended consequences of decisions that public services such as schools could make.

Unless we are specifically advised otherwise by Public Health England, we will continue with our normal educational provision in our school. Not to do so would put pupils' education at risk, and would put great stress on parents/carers, especially those who cannot work from home – e.g. people in health services, the emergency services, logistics, utilities, and every service that keeps us going.

School is also very aware that if we close for any reason, we potentially put children at risk in a different way when so many parents and carers have to go to work.

Therefore, we follow the advice of Public Health England and emphasise the importance of everyone taking sensible precautions:

- Washing hands thoroughly and frequently during the day we have revised how we are conducting this after a number of parents have said that children are getting sore hands;
- Covering your mouth if you have a cough and using and then throwing away tissues, if you have a cough or sneeze; and
- Teaching pupils, in an age-appropriate way, about risk, being responsible and doing our best for the common good.

Parental Decisions

- If your child is ill and needs to stay off school, please inform us as normal. If you suspect this may be coronavirus, follow the advice of Public Health England (https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-people-with-confirmed-or-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection)
- If your child has been in contact with someone who is thought to have coronavirus, there is no reason to keep them at home unless they are themselves showing symptoms. There is an online checking tool that parents can access if they are unsure https://111.nhs.uk/covid-19

Presently staff are already preparing work/activities for the children should the Government decide to shut schools. However, children have access to Purple Mash and TT Rock Stars (Yr 2-6) which they can access at home already and we have also attached a non-screen activity sheet and spelling sheets for the various year groups to this newsletter to help. Teachers are unable to organise individual learning packs for those children that aren't in school whilst we are still open, but the above activities should help.

Working Together and Communications

In situations like this, where there are a lot of unknowns, it is particularly important that home and school work together, in the interests of our children, first and foremost, and also in the knowledge that there is a wider public interest for our children, and we must take advice from the experts. We will inform parents and carers through various means if there are any changes. However, we are also aware that there are a number of parents that haven't signed up to Class Dojo so we must insist that this is done as a matter of urgency as this will be the main way that teachers will be liaising with parents during this time.

The most important thing is that we help each other by reinforcing sensible hygiene precautions at home and at school and talking to our children in a way that is age appropriate about risk, acting responsibly and thinking about the potential consequences of our actions for ourselves and others. It also means recognising that there are experts and people who manage issues which affect the general public and it is important to pull together and act upon their advice.

Thank you for your patience during this tricky time. We will, as always keep you updated as/when required.


SKOOLSOUT - Wrap Around Childcare
