COVID UPDATES FOLLOWING NEW GUIDANCE

Please see below, the information we have received from Tameside.

'Last week the government published its 'Living with COVID-19', which outlines some of the key changes in the approach to tackling the pandemic in the coming weeks and months.

Living with COVID-19' outlines a range of significant changes, some of which took taken effect last week. These key changes include the end of legal requirements to isolate for people with a positive test and unvaccinated contacts; the end of routine contact tracing including the end of advice for close contacts to do daily testing; the end of advice for people to do regular twice weekly asymptomatic lateral flow tests, including school staff and pupils in secondary schools (apart from special schools and alternative provision); the end of financial and practical support offers for those required to isolate.

Despite these changes, the current public health advice remains that people with COVID-19 symptoms should isolate and book a PCR test. And anyone who tests positive either via LFT or PCR test, should isolate for 10 days (but can do LFTs on day 5 and 6, and safely return to normal activities on day 6 if both are negative). While this is no longer legally enforceable, it is still advised for all staff and pupils in schools and settings. In most cases, parents and carers will agree that a pupil with the key symptoms of, or who test positive for COVID-19 should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending your school where they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, you can take the decision to refuse the pupil if, in your reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19. This advice is in line with other infectious diseases and illnesses.'

With all of this in mind, we have taken the decision that we would follow the advice for any child to continue to isolate if they tested positive and would not allow them to attend school until they tested negative for two consecutive days (after day 5 of isolation). We hope that parents understand and support us with this decision.

YEAR 4 HOME TIME ARRANGEMENTS

As restrictions have been lifted and social distancing is not in place now, the Year 4 children will be released from the gate near the kitchen (near the field) at 3.25pm, rather than the bottom door next to the car park from Friday 4 March. Releasing the children from the bottom door was never an ideal place for the children to be dismissed from, but now that parents can gather more freely in smaller spaces, we feel that this is a better scenario and is also safer than parents and children waiting on Mill Lane. Ideally, we would also like to move their home time back 5 minutes to their original finishing time, but we will review this and see how these new arrangements work and let you know in due course.


