### SPEAK OUT. STAY SAFE ASSEMBLIES

I am pleased to tell you that in the next few weeks we will be participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. online programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom based activities. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel

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Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline.

In the online assembly, the Speak out. Stay safe. messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec.

We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of the programme, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.

### TALK PANTS RESOURCES FOR PARENTS

Talk PANTS is a resource set up for parents/schools by the NSPCC. Parents can sign up to receive free information/advice about how to sensitively and age appropriately educate their child to understand that their body belongs to them, and they should tell someone they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried. The website states, '*You've probably already talked to your child about things like crossing the road safely. But have you spoken to them about how to stay safe from sexual abuse? We know it's a conversation no parent wants to have, but we believe it can feel just as natural, and be just as easy, as the road safety chat.'*

### SCHOOL MEALS IN SEPTEMBER

#### Year 2 children moving into Year 3

If your child is currently in year 2 and is moving to year 3 in September and is on school meals they will no longer qualify for Universal Free School meals (not income based free school meals), therefore the cost of a school meal is £2.34 payable on Schoolmoney. This is to be paid in advance either weekly/monthly or termly. If you would like to change your current meal arrangement for your child please let us know by emailing the school office by Friday 1 July 2022. If we don't hear from you, we will assume you want to continue with the meal choice your child is on currently.

#### Meal choices in September

If you would like to change your child's meal choice from school meals to packed lunches or vice versa from September please email the school office by Friday 1 July 2022. If we don't hear from you we will assume you want your child to continue with the meal choice your child is on currently.

#### Year 1 moving in to Year 2

Year 1 children who are on school meals will be able to choose their meals on the day when they move up in September as they will then be dining in the hall.

### COOK FOR LIFE OPPORTUNITY – DEADLINE FOR SIGNING UP 27.6.22

There is an opportunity for up to 5 families to take part in a Cook4Life programme organised by the Children's Nutrition Team and Active Tameside starting on Wednesday 6 July for three consecutive weeks. The team would provide a set of ingredients for each family and will deliver them to the school on the day of the course for the children to take home, along with a recipe card and some nutritional information around a different subject each week. There will also be a step by step guide on how to follow the recipe sent to each family. (There will be no fresh meat in the recipes that we will use due to storage and food hygiene risks).

The team would like the families to cook the meal at home using the recipe and then email or tweet their photos to them. Someone from the team would then telephone each family for a chat about what they've cooked and they can also take the opportunity to ask us any questions around each nutrition subject.
