REMINDER - END OF SCHOOL DAY FROM SEPT 22

As you will be aware, with the building work planned, we will only have one entrance for the children to be dropped off at and collected from in the main school for a period of time in September. To try and alleviate the pressure on the gate near the SHINE wall (next to the kitchen), Year 6 will be released via the door near the car park until the main entrance has been completed. VANDALISM

We have been experiencing some vandalism on and around the field and pitch recently which is costing the school money to fix. This money should be spent on the children in school, not on fixing fences. To give you an idea of cost, it costs at least £100 to replace one fence panel. We have erected signs around the perimeter fencing and have had to use anti-vandal paint to try and reduce this.

We have always left the pitch open for members of the public to use and continue to plan to do this, but due to the field previously being used to exercise dogs and dog waste being a problem a number of years ago, we have had to fence the field in for Health and Safety reasons

We are hopeful that the damage caused isn't by any of the children from Milton St John's, but please can you remind the children that they should not be playing on the field when school is closed and ask them not to dig under the fences to get in. From a health and safety point of view, the gaps that are being dug out may mean that our younger children cannot use the field during school time as they will be able to get out.

If you do see anyone on the field, please let us know or contact the local community PCSOs.

SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

The school uniform is as follows and is based on the colour royal blue and red. Please note that we will be continuing to expect the children to wear the school PE kit on PE days (to be confirmed). Please ensure that your child's PE kit follows our uniform rules – correct colours and no branded items. **Can we also ask that you do not buy big rucksacks for your children to bring in. Due to a lack of space in the corridors and the spacing of the coat pegs, large rucksacks do not fit on the children's pegs and often end up on the floor as trip hazards. Book bags, drawstring bags and separate lunch boxes work best (lunch boxes have designated areas to be stored).** From September if your child brings in a rucksack, they may be asked not to bring it in again, so please spare your expense of not buying one over the summer.

SCHOOL DINNERS

From September 2022 the cost of a school meal will be increasing by 2p, making the new charge £2.36 per day. This is due to the cost of food and energy price increases. Unless we are advised otherwise (by Mellors, our caterers) our school meal prices will not be reviewed again until April 2023.
