IMPORTANT INFORMATION - HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

You may be aware from recent items in the press that the Government are concerned about children's absence from school and they believe that it is not in a child's best interest to be away from school at any time. Therefore, an absence from school should be avoided at all costs. Here at Milton St John's we make it clear that leave will only be treated as authorised in quite exceptional circumstances. <u>Holidays in term time are not an exceptional circumstance and will always be classed as an unauthorised absence.</u>

Please be aware that unauthorised absences may lead to a Penalty Notice for irregular school attendance. If a child takes more than one holiday in term time during their school life, we are being encouraged to refer the matter to Tameside MBC's Education Welfare Service for consideration of a prosecution under Section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996. Parents/carers need to be aware that a conviction of an offence under Section 444(1) of the Education Act carries a fine of up to £1000.


